



A majority of parents have signed up for the JMC On-Line Parent program offered by the school district. Attendance and lunch balances (plus you can pay on-line too) can be monitored with internet access. For 3rd grade and above, parents can also monitor the academic progress of their child. Your child at some point this school year has mentioned our "Box Tops 4 Education". Numerous companies offer these "coupons" on their products. Our school can turn-in these items and receive money to benefit our students. Thanks for your help again! The "Box Tops" can be turned in twice a year. The second deadline is March 1, 2016 (if you still have some please send to the school).

For 1st-4th grades, a hand-out will be given to you showing the results of the Iowa Assessments taken in November 2015 (formerly called ITBS) taken by your child. Effective in 2014-2015, all students in grades K-3rd grade take the FAST assessment test plus this year we added the 4th grade. Information may be shared with you about these tests at conferences and/or with a letter. Thank you for your continued support!

Students can enter group projects in the Junk Yard Wars Vehicle Competition as well as the Pneumatic Ball Launcher. Students will be able to participate in mini competitions during the day as well. Competitions will include welding, nail pounding, drill driving, and more.

Curriculum Corner

I hope this newsletter all finds us basking in the warm rays of sunshine. If not, some of us might be getting pretty crabby:) Last newsletter I shared with you some of our lowa Assessment Data. This month I would like to update you on all I have been doing at K-P.

I know some of you feel like your child is never in school or every time you turn around, it is an early out. I just want to give you a little insight into what we do on those early out's. We are busy each first Wednesday of the month learning in professional development. The K-4 teachers work with Mr. Wiese. They usually discuss FAST (Formative Assessment System for Teachers) or work on collaboration with an area of focus in mine. In grades 5-12 we are assigned groups and we delve further into A.I.W. (Authentic Intellectual Work) AIW has been very well received here at K-P. One or two teachers a month brings a task they plan to teach. This is a lesson they know needs work. The groups then score the task with a 3-4 point rubric. We look at how well the knowledge is constructed, if there is elaborated communication, and what value the lesson has beyond the school walls. We then discuss our scores together and the most valuable part of the discussion (in my opinion) is the suggestions we give one another on how to improve their lesson. It really is pretty neat to see one of our 5th grade teachers help the Industrial Tech teacher or vice versa. After the discussion, the teacher is to revise the lesson. We post all lessons, new and revised, plus our team notes on our AIW website. This is a valuable tool that all teachers in our district can look at for ideas and see what each group accomplished during their time together. The teachers are able to take this class for a renewal credit as well which most of them greatly appreciate. The only complaint I hear about AIW is that they would like to get together more often. The one Wednesday a month is just not enough especially like February as that Wednesday was snowed out.

Mr. Bailey and I are getting ready to post the Teacher Leadership and Compensation jobs we will have available at K-P next year. The positions we are offering are: (3) Model Teachers, (2) Digital Literacy Coaches, and (5) Instructional Coaches. If you remember, the grant must employ 25% of our staff so that is how we came up with the number of positions being offered. Each job has a detailed description. The positions all require the teachers to work 5-10 extended contract days. We hope to have all the interviews completed and positions filled by May 1st. Personally I am really excited to finally put this grant into action. Plus I am super excited to get to work more closely with some of our exemplary teachers.

As you can tell the learning never stops at K-P. That is my favorite part about being an educator :)-
