School Health Information

The Kingsley-Pierson CSD and the providers at Kingsley Mercy Medical Clinic together have decided to not do a mass physical day but rather to have each individual see their family provider for their sports physical this year. They feel making this change is for the best interest of the student and their health. Parents will now need to be responsible for scheduling their own child's physical appointment. Please try to do this ASAP and turn completed physical and concussion forms into the main office.

The 9th graders have completed their CPR/AED/ First Aid course during Health classes.

I will soon be sending out informational letters and a certificate of dental screening form to all parents of 8th grade students . This is the 7th year that the dental screening is a requirement for all students entering kindergarten and 9th grade. Please take the dental screening certificate to your dentist. Have them fill it out after an exam over the summer and return it to the school in the fall.

I will also be sending out a reminder letter to parents of incoming 7th grade students that they need to have received a Tdap booster before school resumes in the fall.

New Immunization Requirement for All Students Entering 7th Grade

The Iowa Department of Public Health, Immunization Program has made a change to the Iowa Administrative Code to require a Tdap vaccination for all adolescents enrolled in secondary school. It was made effective beginning with the 2013-2014 school year. The new language is intended to require adolescents entering 7th grade (approximately 13 years of age) to have one dose of the Tdap vaccine.

This requirement will help Iowa achieve and maintain high vaccination adolescent coverage levels while reducing the number of pertussis (whooping cough) cases occurring annually in Iowa.

As you schedule physicals for athletics or if you are in your physician's office this spring or summer, please ask about this booster vaccine. Documentation of the Tdap vaccine on the Certificate of Immunization will need to be provided to the middle school nurse prior to the first day of school.

Book Bash! K-P Middle School participated for their second year in the Northwest AEA's Book Bash in Sioux City. Those students willing to accept the Book Bash challenge included Shelby Schweitzberger, Shayley Haggin, Blake Morgan, Kylie Beelner, Emerson Benson, and Sam Miller.

Teams were provided with a list of twenty books to read before the competition. Book Bash took place on April 29, 2016 with two rounds of competition. In the first round, 34 middle school teams worked diligently for 60 minutes to correctly answer 258 multiple choice questions covering the 20 books. The top four teams then advanced to the second round where they answered essay questions about the books.

Although the Kingsley-Pierson Page Turner team did not advance to the second round of competition, they did tie with two other teams for a sixth place finish. The team had a great time and look forward to competing again next year!



Books, books, and more books-the 5th graders participated in the Iowa Reading Challenge, an online competition, this year. Thirteen 5th graders opted to take on the challenge of reading as many of the twenty-five books on this year's list as they could. Curriculum Corner

Being a Language Arts teacher almost my whole career has been very helpful when stepping up into this new position. One of my tasks is to help teachers write grants. With the state giving schools very little in funding, we have to do all we can to secure funds to provide programs for our students. One such grant that we have written the past two years is the Iowa Agriculture Literacy Foundation grant.

The Iowa Agriculture Literacy Foundation in partnership with the Iowa Farm Bureau Federation offers grants up to \$200 to support the integration of agriculture into regular classroom instruction or after school programs with an academic focus. Agriculture in the Classroom Teacher Supplement Grants are designed to initiate new projects or expand existing projects that promote agricultural literacy. Grants can be used to fund innovative lessons, activities, classroom resources, guest speakers, outreach programs, field trips and other projects. Kathy Ploeger, our school librarian, helped write 3 separate grants again this year to get funding for all 3 of our libraries: elementary, middle school, and high school. Being that our students are rural kids, they enjoy new reading materials that emphasize agriculture.

The Iowa Agriculture Literacy Foundation grants allow us to keep our collection current on the topic of agriculture. Students are able to use these books for outside reading in an area that interests them. In the middle school we used the books to supplement the curriculum to examine agriculture all over the world. Laura Boustead, middle school social studies teacher, also received the grant this year. Laura's focus for her grant was on purchasing multiple copies of the book, *What the World Eats*, by Faith D'Aluisio. This book was utilized in 7th Grade Geography on a project that allowed the students to learn first hand about families from all around the world. Learning about the agriculture, economy, and meals from other countries has really enhanced the students' understanding of the world they live in.

Jayne Vondrak, high school English teacher, was also awarded another Iowa Agriculture Literacy grant this year. Jayne used her funds to purchase a class set of *Temple Grandin's Animals Make Us Human*. English II students have read selected chapters from the book as the unit has been tailored to meet the interests of individuals. Some students focused on family pets, such as cats or dogs, while others concentrated on farm animals, for example cows, pigs and horses. Students have conducted observations and will create infographics to demonstrate their learning. Not only have the sophomores learned about Temple Grandin's influence in the cattle industry and the general welfare of animals, they have also learned about how Grandin has

overcome her challenges with Asperger's Autism.

Valerie Sitzmann, middle school math teacher, wrote a program award request to the Iowa Stem (science, technology, engineering, and math) Scale-Up Program. The program Val will be implementing next year is "PowerTeaching Math." It was developed by Johns Hopkins Researchers. PowerTeaching Math is the leader in cooperative learning mathematics instruction helping teachers transform their classroom environments to engage ALL students in grades 6-8. PowerTeaching Math is an instructional approach that links Common Core state standards and school curricula to research-proven instructional strategies and classroom resources that promote rigor and student engagement. PowerTeaching Math empowers students to work together to improve their understanding of mathematics concepts, and encourages them to take ownership of their learning during multiple opportunities for practice and evaluation. With over 25 years of research, PowerTeaching has been demonstrated to increase academic success by establishing a student-centered classroom through the use of compelling concept presentations, assessments for learning, and student learning teams.

Kris Hackett, K-12 art teacher, and I just wrote a \$5000 Art Equipment grant that will provide exciting new opportunities in the high school if we are selected to receive the award. Please keep your fingers crossed as we should know in a few weeks.

The TLC (Teacher Leadership and Compensation) grant that I wrote last year with the help of our committee: Michelle Schroeder, Amy Bailey, Valerie Sitzmann, Erin Hoffman, and Jayne Vondrak will begin this July 1st. Last month I told you about the application process in our district. I am pleased to report that all of the positions have been filled. Those accepting the positions and their new titles (along with 100% teaching) are Mark Schroeder, Michelle Schroeder, and Chuck Hackett- model teachers. Our Instructional Coaches in K-4 are Amy Bailey and Laura Boustead. In the middle school our Instructional Coach will be Valerie Sitzmann. In the high school we have hired Jayne Vondrak and Kris Hackett as our Instructional Coaches. We also employed 2 Digital Literacy Coaches, Jackie Lammers and Erin Hoffman, which will be responsible for helping our staff with current technology and any new technologies that we purchase. These Teacher Leaders will be busy training over the summer to better prepare for their added positions in the fall.

If your business offers school grants or you know of a grant we should be applying for please let me know. We may not always get the funding, but you can't win if you don't play!
